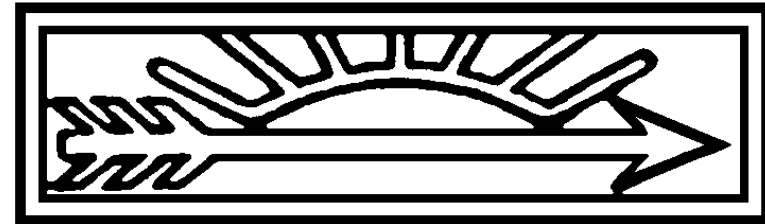

A Brief History of Cub Scouting and The Blue and Gold Banquet

On February 10th 1930, the National Executive Board of the Boy Scouts of America approved the Cub Scout Program as an experiment and authorized Cub Packs to register with the BSA. Cub books were issued at that time included:

Bear
Lion
Parent's Cub Book
And
Cub Leader's Outline

Uniforms for boys were issued for a cost of \$6.05. During the first year 5,102 boys, 1,433 Pack Leaders, and 243 Packs became the Cub Scout Program. Today, there are more than 2 million Cub Scouts and ½ million Leaders in 50,000 Packs nationwide.

Every February thereafter, Cub Scout Packs from around the country have held Blue and Gold Banquets to commemorate the anniversary of Cub Scouting in the USA.

We gather to celebrate the birthday of Cub Scouting and to honor the achievements of the members of Pack 800.

We are especially proud to recognize our second year Webelos for a job well done as all have earned the Arrow of Light Award. This is the highest Rank award bestowed in Cub Scouting!

Congratulations, Pack 800, and best wishes to the bridging Webelos as they embark on many new adventures in their lives, and on the Boy Scout Trail.

We would also like to give thanks to all of the graduating parents who have held trained leadership positions. Their efforts enabled safe, quality Scouting programs over the years.
